EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION

FAM offers students an integrated educational program from preschool to high school. Every child receives the school supplies they need to study, transportation to and from school, nutritious snacks and a well-rounded education. The program includes class -room instruction, books, computer lab and activities such as sports, music and art. FAM places a special focus on keeping girls in school, as they are often the first to drop out. High school graduates—often the first in their family to do so—receive guidance on furthering their education.

For more than one hundred years, Asturias Maldonado family members have provided health and education services to rural farm families. The Asturias Maldonado Foundation conti -nues to promote and support the ideals and aspirations that have supported these families for generations.


