
Dear Donors, Supporters and Friends,

Vision	Transforming the lives of rural families in La Reforma, San Marcos, Guatemala through high quality multi-generational education.
Mision	Advancing a model PreK-13 school in which students graduate with employable skills, are self-reliant and contribute to the economic growth of their communities.
Goals	 Empower students to acquire, demonstrate and articulate strong values and character traits in order to become productive citizens. Ensure all students are literate in skills related to math, reading, comprehension and computers. Ensure all high school graduates will have learned a vocational skill and have a plan to enter the workforce or higher education. Recruit, attract and retain high quality teachers. Partner with a model Guatemalan school to provide professional development, quality curriculum, student assessment and global interactive learning.

2022 School Year





During 2022, students returned to in person classes 4 days a week during 4.5 hours a day, which allowed them to have an adequate learning level while still protecting their health and that of their families. Additional objectives during the school year included:

- a. Reinforcing and leveling learning among students.
- b. Creating learning habits in different school subjects.
- c. Developing abilities in different areas of education.

The school year developed normally and students were both committed and happy to return to school in person.

Diagnostic Assessment and Reinforcement

The diagnostic assessment seeks to identify strengths and weaknesses of students. Teachers assess students at the beginning of every school year and then plan special activities addressed to those who need specific support as well as to new students. The assessment is done jointly with Habilmind, an educational platform that not only evaluates students, but suggests solutions for teachers and students to work together towards academic excellence.

As a result of the mentioned assessment, remedial and leveling activities mainly focused on Mathematics and Language Arts, which proved to be the students' major weaknesses. According to the evaluations, 100% virtual learning was responsible for this drop in student achievement, which made individual follow up difficult for teachers, despite efforts made. Going back to in person classes is expected to help improve these results in future assessments.






Parents' School

During the second semester of the 2022 school year, Parenting School activities were resumed. Two conferences for parents were delivered:

- Assertiveness: free and safe expression
- Communication and family integration.

A structured work plan will be in place during the 2023 School Year.



Diploma Courses

FAM collaborates and works with other institutions that implement education programs for youngsters and adults. During 2022, a group of high school boys and girls of the Institute supported by FAM participated in the diploma course "Cell phone repair", delivered by INTECAP, in collaboration with the Ministry of Labor and Funcafé.

2022 Graduates

Twelve students graduated from High School level during 2022, divided into two groups:

10 students completed the Industrial Baccalaureate specialized in Computer Science and

2 completed the Science and Arts Baccalaureate Program (US High School equivalent).

FAM takes pride in the personal and academic achievements of its students, contributing to a better future for each of its graduates and their families.






Reading Contest


